Until 6 January **The Wheeldon Family**

An exhibition celebrating members of the Wheeldon Family in many of its aspects, artists, collectors and designers.

14-27 January **Jill Wood and Colleagues**

A celebration of Art in Schools. In the first week artworks by North Hykeham joint sixth form students will be shown, followed in the second week with work by art teachers in Lincolnshire.

28 January – 10 February **Andrew Riddle**

Fine artworks including paintings, drawings and collages based around landscapes, portraits, figures and symbols.

11-24 February **Amelia Beavis-Harrison**

An exhibition of contemporary fine art practice by a relatively new artist/curator/manager. A mixed show full of energy and new imagery.

25 February – 9 March **Ruth O'Sullivan**

An exhibition of paintings concerned with identity and the laws of nature. Strong colours and dramatic landscapes.

10-23 March **Craftlincs**

This is the first exhibition of the newly formed craft group comprising University of Lincoln staff members. Work to include stone, paper, ceramic, glass, metal and furniture.

24 March – 6 April **Janis Mitchell and Susan Wall**

A mixed exhibition of fine art. These artists have not shown at the Gallery before but remain determined to put together, possibly with additional artists, a remarkable experience.

7-20 April **Carlton le Moorland Art Group**

Last year this group of local artists were well received by visitors to the Gallery and they now feel more ambitious and ready to expand upon their original showing.

21 April – 4 May **Douglas and Lizzie Huxtable**

An ex-Lincoln student and her husband have put together an accessible, inclusive exhibition at a time when drawing and illustration are enjoying renewed attention. The work will be accessibly priced with prints and cards on.

5-18 May **University of Lincoln: Photography**

Under the careful guidance of Keith James, Photography Course Tutor, students will be exhibiting a wide range of photographic imagery.

19 May – 1 June **Lindum Textile Artists**

This professional group of textile artists and makers has previously exhibited in the Gallery. New works which clearly demonstrate a high degree of making, colour and visual independence are promised.

2-15 June **Roger Corcoran and Drawing Students**

Roger is a recognised teacher of drawing and can often be a hard taskmaster. However his students follow him with some real allegiance and continue to discover and develop their own drawing capability.

16 June – 3 August

Peter Peri

A special exhibition commissioned by the Sam Scorer Gallery and Bishop Grosseteste University College. This unique exhibition of drawings, prints, paintings and sculptures represent the working life of Peter Peri. More detailed information will be released nearer the time.

4-17 August

The Shaws

This partnership of artists has put together a mixed exhibition of painting and sculpture. This is their first exhibition in the Gallery.

18-31 August

Nadin Group

In 2007 this group of artists recorded probably their best exhibition for many years. The Gallery welcomes the group once again and looks forward to a mixed exhibition of paintings, sculpture, drawing and printmaking which demonstrate the good practices so well promoted by Gill Nadin.

1–14 September

Allen Smith

Allen is still pushing forward his own new boundaries and ideas associated with drawing and painting. Allen is very single-minded in promoting himself as an artist and the Gallery looks forward to exhibiting his new works.

15-28 September

Mary Rogers

Large paintings illustrating the transition of time, if only for a few moments, from one painting to the next through colour and form with a continuous horizon line.

29 September – 12 October **David Paton and Friends**

David, a respected teacher, artist and long-time member of the Lincolnshire Artists Society is selecting a mixed exhibition of versatile and familiar local artists. This intriguing show will contain many surprises.

13-26 October

Phil Cosker

A familiar name to many as a photographer, filmmaker, teacher, writer and presently Director of the Hub National Centre for Craft and Design. He will present a fascinating series of photographic images which promise to be most challenging and thought-provoking.

27 October – 9 November

Richard Bett

Richard celebrates his 55th year in style with these very specialised silver and large-scale metal works. He is a very experienced designer maker and sculptor with a unique personality.

10-23 November

Lyn Lovitt

An excellent display of her work last year has encouraged Lyn to promote herself again through a widening experience of drawing and painting as well as her more established ceramics.

24 November – 7 December

Nicola McLean

A very interesting painter employing aspects of natural forms cleverly detailed, together with a strong colour palette in order to construct a series of fascinating pictorial surfaces.

8-21 December

Contemporary Craft Network

This group of professional makers has been exhibiting for 20 years with notable success. Membership continues to expand as do individual craft practices. This exhibition offers excellent crafts at reasonable prices - ideal for Christmas presents.

22 December – 4 January **Phil Bowman and friends**

A selection of drawings and paintings paying particular reference to the image and colour.
